- **Presenters should participate the workspace, and add the channel of your presentation.**
- We have sent information on how to join the slack workspace to registrants.

Channels on Slack

We have prepared the following channels on the workspace.

- **#channel of each session** : 「#session_[session name]」

A list of the presentations is described on the channel for each session. The channels for each session are set as default channels. On these channels, you can ask questions related to the entire of the session.

- **#channel of each presentation** : 「#presentation number」

You can ask questions for each presentation.

- **#random** :

You can chat any topics on this channel.

- **#help** :

If you have questions or trouble, please comment on this channel.
